Case Study

Josh Hull, Michigan

- Josh explained the structure of MCIR via slides.
- There are many decisions to make in implementing SmartyStreets; it's best to make these early. Some examples for Michigan:
 - When a provider has more than one address, Michigan is more interested in its physical address.
 - If an address times out and doesn't go to SmartyStreets, how is it re-sent later?
 - Do you let a provider know of a bad address or override it when it comes in?
- Michigan created an address cache.
 - **Action Item:** Josh will explore whether Michigan will permit him to share the code for the address cache he developed.
